- 4. What significant role does the prophet Shemaiah play during Rehoboam's reign in 2 Chronicles 11-12?

Discussion Question: How do the events in 2 Chronicles 10-12 demonstrate the consequences of poor leadership, the importance of remaining faithful to God, and the power of humility in difficult situations?

- 4. How does King Jehoshaphat promote the worship of God and obedience to His laws in 2 Chronicles 17?



July 15

- 1. What reforms does King Jehoshaphat of Judah implement in 2 Chronicles 19?
- 2. How does Jehoshaphat respond when a vast army comes against Judah?
- 3. What is the outcome of the battle in Ch. 20, and how does God intervene?
- ${\bf 4.} \ {\bf What is the \ primary \ message \ of the \ prophet \ Jehu \ to \ King \ Jehoshaphat \ in \ Ch 19?}$

Discussion Question: How do the events in 2 Chronicles 19-21 highlight the importance of seeking God's guidance in times of crisis, the power of prayer, and the responsibility of leaders to implement just policies?



the Answers

JULY 9

- 1. Wisdom and knowledge to govern Israel and judge the people.
- 2. Cedars from Lebanon, skilled laborers, and craftsmen.
- 3. The length is 60 cubits, and the width is 20 cubits.
- 4. Gold, silver, bronze, iron, and various types of wood and stone.

JULY 10

- 1. Huram-Abi, a skilled craftsman.
- 2.10 cubits in diameter, 5 cubits high, and 30 cubits in circumference.
- 3. He prays that God will hear the prayers of His people when they face various situations and turn to Him.
- 4. The bronze altar, the Sea (a large basin), ten basins for washing, ten golden lampstands, and various tables and utensils.

JULY 11

- 1. God sends fire from heaven to consume the sacrifices and fills the temple with His glory.
- 2. If Solomon and the people of Israel are obedient and faithful, God will establish the kingdom of Israel forever. If they turn away from Him, they will face destruction.
- 3. The Queen of Sheba visits Solomon and is left speechless by his wisdom and the grandeur of his kingdom.
- 4. She is overwhelmed and praises the Lord for His blessings upon Solomon and Israel.

JULY 12

- 1. Rehoboam's harsh response to the people's request for lighter burdens leads the northern tribes to rebel and form their own kingdom.
- 2. The Levites and those who still worship the Lord.
- 3. Rehoboam humbles himself before God, and as a result, God does not allow the complete destruction of Jerusalem. However, they become subject to Egypt.
- 4. Shemaiah delivers God's messages to Rehoboam, including the reason for the kingdom's division and a warning against fighting the northern tribes.

the Answers

JULY 13

- 1. He emphasizes the importance of remaining faithful to God and the fact that Israel has abandoned the Lord by worshiping idols.
- 2. Abijah's forces are victorious because they relied on the Lord, and Jeroboam's forces suffer heavy casualties.
- 3. As a removes idols from the land, repairs the altar of the Lord, and leads the people in making a covenant to seek the Lord.
- 4. Abijah confronts them in battle, urging them to recognize God's covenant with David and abandon their idolatry.

JULY 14

- 1. As a relies on the King of Aram for help against Israel instead of seeking the Lord's guidance and support.
- 2. As a becomes angry and imprisons Hanani, and he also oppresses some of the people.
- 3. Micaiah predicts that Israel will be scattered, and King Ahab will be killed.
- 4. Jehoshaphat sends officials, Levites, and priests throughout Judah to teach the people the Book of the Law, strengthening their commitment to the Lord.

JULY 15

- 1. He appoints judges throughout the land, encouraging them to judge justly and fear the Lord.
- 2. He seeks the Lord's help, calls for a fast, and leads the people in prayer.
- 3. God causes the invading armies to turn on each other, resulting in their destruction. Judah's forces do not need to fight and only collect the spoils from the battlefield.
- 4. Jehu rebukes Jehoshaphat for helping the wicked King Ahab but also acknowledges the king's efforts to remove idolatry from Judah.
