- 4. Who are the leaders of the first group of returning exiles in Ezra 2?



EZRA 6-10

- 1. How does King Darius respond when he finds the decree of Cyrus in Ezra 6?
- 2. What is the response of the people when the temple is completed in Ezra 6?
- 3. In Ezra 7, what is Ezra's mission when he is sent to Jerusalem by King Artaxerxes?
- 4. What issue does Ezra address in Ezra 10, and how does he resolve it?

Discussion Question: How do the events in Ezra 6-10 demonstrate the importance of God's providential care, the role of spiritual leaders in teaching God's law, and the need for maintaining a distinct identity as God's peope?



# JULY 16 The Answers

- 1. Jehosheba, the daughter of King Jehoram, hides Joash and his nurse in the temple.
- 2. The priest Jehoiada leads a conspiracy to overthrow Athaliah and anoints Joash as king in the temple.
- 3. He organizes a collection of offerings from the people to repair and restore the temple.
- 4. Jehoiada helps protect and eventually crown the young Joash, guiding him in his early years as king and overseeing the restoration of the temple.

#### JULY 17

- 1. He brings the idols of the Edomites back to Judah and begins to worship them.
- 2. Uzziah is successful because he seeks the Lord and follows the instructions of the prophet Zechariah.
- 3. Uzziah becomes prideful and attempts to burn incense in the temple, a task reserved for priests. God strikes him with leprosy as punishment.
- 4. Jotham's reign is more faithful to God than both his father's and his son's, with fewer instances of idolatry and more focus on following the Lord.

#### JULY 18

- 1. Ahaz leads Judah into idolatry and the nation suffers from various military defeats.
- 2. He orders the Levites and priests to remove all defilement from the temple and reconsecrate it.
- 3. He sends messengers throughout Israel and Judah, inviting them to come to Jerusalem and celebrate the Passover.
- 4. Oded warns the people of Israel not to enslave the people of Judah, leading to the release of the captives.

### JULY 19

- 1. He organizes the priests and Levites, restores the contributions for the temple, and removes idolatry from the land.
- 2. He seeks the Lord's help, fortifies the city, and encourages the people to trust in God.
- 3. Manasseh rebuilds the high places, erects altars for idols, and practices various forms of wickedness.
- 4. They generously contribute to the temple's needs by bringing tithes, offerings, and other gifts.

# the Answers

#### JULY 20

- 1. The Book of the Law.
- 2. He initiates religious reforms throughout the kingdom, removes idolatry, and leads the people in renewing their covenant with God.
- 3. Judah is eventually conquered by the Babylonians, the temple is destroyed, and the people are taken into exile.
- 4. The people pledge themselves to the covenant and promise to follow the Lord's commands, as written in the Book of the Law.

#### JULY 21

- 1. King Cyrus of Persia.
- 2. They face opposition from the neighboring people who try to discourage them and cause delays by sending accusations to the Persian kings.
- 3. They encourage the people to resume the temple's construction and assure them of God's support.
- 4. Zerubbabel, Jeshua, and other family and tribal leaders.

#### JULY 22

- 1. He orders the temple's construction to be completed without interference and provides financial support from the royal treasury.
- 2. The people celebrate with joy, dedicating the temple with sacrifices and observing the Passover and the Festival of Unleavened Bread.
- 3. To teach the people God's laws and ensure that they are being followed.
- 4. He addresses the issue of the Jewish people marrying foreign women, leading them to confess their sins and send away their foreign wives and children.
